



FAQ's (Frequently Asked Questions)



- Q: There is a Scout in our troop who would like to go to camp, but will be out of town the week the troop signed up to go. Is there a way he can still enjoy summer camp?
- A: Yes, we have a provisional camp program. The provisional camp program is offered all 6 weeks of camp to accommodate Scouts who can't attend with their home troop.
- Q: Is there scholarship money available for Scouts who need financial assistance to pay for the cost of camp?
- A: Yes, the Los Angeles Area Council has a campership fund and applications are available at the Council Service Center.
- Q: When our Troop makes a reservation for camp, do we get to choose our campsite?
- A: Campsites at Circle X at Big Horn and Camp Pollock are assigned based on the number of Scouts you are bringing to camp.
- Q: What makes each of the two boy scout camps unique?
- A: Camp Circle X at Big Horn is a traditional dining hall camp. Camp Pollock is our "Back-to-basics" patrol method camp that is troop run and staff supported camp which allows the troop to develop and implement much of its own program.
