



GET IN THE GAME GEOCACHING IN THE L.A.A.C.

The game is afoot, what is it? It is Geocaching!

Geocaching is an electronics-driven treasure hunt, Geocaching combines sleuthing and hiking. From “geo” for geography and “caching” for hiding goods, Geocaching has gained a worldwide following since it began in 2000. Geocaching uses Global Positioning System handhelds to find pre-established waypoints where others have left a “cache,” or hidden container full of prizes, for them to take.

Where can I find these caches?

Currently at Cabrillo Beach Youth Center and Firestone Scout Reservation. Five caches have been hidden at Cabrillo and twelve have been hidden at Firestone. To play the game contact the program staff at each of the above locations. They will provide you with instruction sheets and GPS devices if you need them.

What do I win?

When you find all of the caches at the location, you are rewarded with a patch rocker that goes around a base patch. The base patch is available for purchase at each of the locations. The cost is only \$5.00.
